

- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- Sliced water chestnuts
- 2 pkgs. butter flake dinner rolls

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix first 6 ingredients in a bowl. Separate rolls into pieces, 2 slices each. Put on a cookie sheet, put tuna/crab mixture on each piece and top with 2-3 slices of chestnuts. Heat for 10-12 minutes.
